



### **Grant Award information and Process:**

The Board of Directors for the Sidney Raider Athletic Booster Club review and award grants.

Grants are disbursed from the general fund in November and May.

Watch for Deadlines and meeting dates. Head coaches should submit a general fund Grant Request form to the Sidney Raider Athletic Booster Club Board of Directors. Coaches are encouraged to contact the Grant Committee board members for help completing the Grant application and supplying supporting documentation.

The general order of priority is:

- Safety
- · What will benefit the athletes the most
- Funding team equipment
- Training seminars, camps, clinics, or tournaments for athletes or coaches
- Special transportation request
- Team awards and recognition

Tips for requesting grants:

- Provide as much information as possible including costs and priorities (be specific)
- Submit your request by the deadline (be on time)
- Be present at the meeting to make your case (be there)
- While the entire team is welcome to attend the presentation, you are required to have at least two athletes as part of the presentation.








## FOOTBALL

2024. What a season. When reflecting on this year, it's almost hard to comprehend all that we accomplished. The amount of pressure on this year's team was immense. Not just the pressure from the outside - high preseason rankings, becoming more of the hunted as opposed to the hunters, but also the high level of pressure that came from the team itself in terms of setting super high goals. When asked how we were going to replace 3 all-staters and 11 seniors from last year's team, our answer was always, we'll just get back to work. This team really took on the attitude of, no matter what happened on Friday, we'll get back to work on Monday. That seemed to fit this group very well.

Cozad and Minden were good tests for us early in the season. Cozad was a playoff team and Minden had just come off their biggest win in a few years. For us, those games were going to be tough no matter who we played, due to the fact that we had so many newcomers to the starting lineup, as well as starters who were in new positions. We had to kind of feel our way through the first couple of games to see who we were going to be.

Holdrege had a bit of a different feel this year as they had just come off winning their first two games of the season. As coaches, we felt this was going to be a pretty tough challenge. Our players, had different opinions. Our players, on this one, were right. It was the first of our 4 shutouts this season and it felt as if our team identity was starting to come into form.

Mitchell was another shutout. This one was very important for our defense. The system Mitchell runs has kind of been a thorn in our side. A team that has massive players, playing football in a phone booth is a tough assignment. We held them to 63 yards rushing. Those are the types of games where you start to think, we might be positioning ourselves for a pretty good season.

Gothenburg was wild and it was weird. During the regular season, we only trailed for a total of 2 minutes and 59 seconds. We were behind in this game for 2 minutes and 46 seconds. As soon as they went ahead 10-7, we drove right down the field and took the lead back. All year, whenever it seemed like things might be going sideways a little bit, our guys just made plays to get things back on track. Gothenburg was a pretty good team that played a very good game. We didn't play our best, but still found a way to win. That pretty much sums up this team. Just find a way to win.

Ogallala. This game always means a lot. Mostly because geographically, this is our closest rival. Also, this was our only regular season loss from a year ago. However, for this year's seniors, it probably meant a little more. Some of you may remember that when these seniors were freshmen, we went down there and lost 48-0. Normally, that would not affect a group of freshmen who weren't going to play in the game all that much. However, a lot of these seniors played in that game. Some of these seniors played a lot in that game. Nearly reversing the score a few years later, sure did feel nice.

The next two weeks were going to be very tough. We were 6-0 and many people were already pointing to our week 9 matchup with Chadron. We still had a very athletic team in Chase County to play. We had our highest offensive output of the season, but you could tell, the guys were ready to get into "playoff mode". Alliance presented a different challenge in terms of their youth. Young players sometimes are just out there playing and if they make one good play, their confidence can lead to a string of good plays. Again, our guys made sure early that this was not going to be one of those nights.

## FOOTBALL - CONT.

Chadron. Finally. The two teams that were going to play for the district title. Both teams were going to make the playoffs. Both teams were going to host a first round playoff game. This game was about a district championship, playoff seeding, and pride. Our guys were awesome. As we all knew, Chadron had a pretty good run game. We held them 182 yards under their season average. Once we got the lead, they pretty much had no chance as we kept their offense off-balanced all night. It was epic.

Undefeated regular season. District Champs. Now, onto the playoffs where we earned the number 1 seed. Another first for our program.

Omaha Roncalli was a scary first round opponent. They had played a lot of really good teams close. They were young, athletic, and threw the ball a lot. We felt we were a better team, but come playoff time, you never know. We started slow. That happens. They tied us at 7 in the second quarter. Then, like we had done all year, we slowly just pulled away from them. Outstanding defense, big special teams plays, and a steady offense capable of big plays as well as time-consuming drives. 30-7. On to the quarter-finals.

Uh-oh. Chadron. Again. A rematch in the playoffs is something no coach ever wants to happen. They had seen what we do and were going to make adjustments. We would be limited on adjustments because that would look silly to make a bunch of changes after we had just beaten them 2 weeks ago. It looked early like their adjustments were going to be effective. 1st drive and they're up 8-0. Yikes. We tie it at 8, but the whole 2nd quarter felt like they were about to score again. They didn't. Our defense was just kind of stingy about letting teams score on us. Big special teams plays again, and an offense that just kept pounding away. Next thing you know - we're 11-0. Heading back to the semi-finals.

No need to relive that one. But, it was a fantastic game in which we had opportunities to win. Central City made a couple more plays than we did. That's sports. That's competition. We had a fantastic season and nobody can argue that. For instance:

- 11 Win Season never been done
- 1st Undefeated-Untied team since 1929
- Defensive records are a little sketchy, but from what I have found best defense since 1971
- Most passing yards for a season
- Added 4 more shutouts 77 total in school history
- Reid Fiscus tied interceptions in a game and a season
- Alek Doty had the most completions in a season, passing yards in a season, passing touchdowns in a game and a season, as well as most total yards in a game and a season
- Landon Riddle had the most receptions in a season and a career, receiving yards in game, season, and a career, touchdowns receiving in a game, season, and a career, as well as the most interceptions in a career, and the longest punt return in school history which by the way is a C1 playoff record.
- Landon Riddle was selected as the Offensive Player of the Year for our district and Keian Kaiser was selected as the Defensive Player of the Year for our district.
- Landon Riddle, Keian Kaiser, Patrick McCartney, Alek Doty, Reid Fiscus, and Owen Gillham were all selected as All-Conference and All-District 1st team members.
- Shane Lilley, Austin Christensen, Ben Monheiser, Zech Roggasch, Anderson Smelley, Conner Hurt, and Lance Holly were all selected as Honorable Mention to one of those teams.

## VOLLEYBALL

To say that the 2024 season was filled with impressive growth and some unexpected performances would be an understatement. The 2024 Raider Volleyball team battled multiple teams that are perennial state tournament qualifiers throughout the year. The players did an incredible job of adjusting and adapting to the multitude of changes that were thrown their way throughout the course of the season. These trials allowed the girls to grow not only as a team on the court, but also as individuals in their own right. Something I try to instill in the girls is that what we're doing is more than just volleyball - it's life lessons.

The success of a season is not always defined in the win-loss column. A lot of the waves that were endured will become, I firmly believe, the foundation of something special in the very near future. The grit these girls possess is going to be a huge determining factor in future successes.

## WRESTLING

The boys were able to put together a solid dual team with all but one weight class full which brought with it several dual wins. The intensity during practice and the leadership of the upperclassmen prepared our boys for some solid wins. Three boys, Patrick McCartney, Zech Roggasch, and Cayson Boltjes, qualified for state this year but we had several others that were right in the mix to get there. Those three boys brought home three medals; two runner ups and one 6th place. They also scored enough team points to have Sidney place 13th overall in Class B. We are looking forward to getting the boys ready for another run at it.

We didn't have a full roster for the girls with three returning seniors, but we did have eight underclassmen join the team.
